Monday, April 1	Visit the California for the Arts website and learn about <u>Arts Culture and Creativity</u> Month. Lots of resources to get you engaged. <u>Register</u> to attend the San Diego kickoff of ACCM on April 5.
Tuesday, April 2	Attend the launch of the National Endowment for the Arts "Indicators Project," a new online research tool designed to disclose key facts and figures about the role of artists and the arts in our lives and communities. <u>Advanced registration</u> is required.
Wednesday, April 3	Do you live in the City of San Diego? Visit the <u>San Diego City Council website</u> , find your representative and learn about their policy priorities.
Thursday, April 4-7	Be an arts advocate and demonstrate your support by participating in the arts. Attend the 4-day La Jolla Playhouse WOW <u>Festival.</u>
Friday, April 5	Join us for the San Diego Kick-Off of ACCM at UC San Diego Park and Market. <u>Register</u> here. It's FREE!
Monday, April 8	Get the facts. Download <u>Ten Reasons to Support the Arts</u> and have your advocacy talking points ready to go.
Tuesday, April 9	Sign up to receive <u>Action Alerts</u> from California Arts Advocates and take action on State and Federal arts policies with a click of a button.
Wednesday, April 10	Do you believe arts education is a student right? Join <u>Create CA</u> , our statewide arts education advocacy organization, and demand the arts education your schools deserve.

Friday, April 12	It's easy to find all your elected officials. Just click <u>here</u> and enter your street address and zip code. Put them in your contacts for future communications.
Saturday, April 13	Write to your elected officials (yes, people still write letters) and tell them why their support of arts and culture matters.
Sunday, April 14	Want to start a conversation with school leaders about arts education? Use this <u>list of</u> <u>questions</u> to begin a dialogue.
Monday, April 15	Schedule coffees with other local leaders in arts and culture to build your network of arts advocates.
Tuesday, April 16	Attend the ACCM Arts Summit in Sacramento and network with likeminded statewide advocates.



Wednesday, April 17	Bring your voice to Sacramento for <u>Arts Advocacy Day</u> . Meet with your legislator and build support for the arts in San Diego.
Thursday, April 18	Send a letter to Governor Newsom thanking him for supporting the arts in California.
Friday, April 19	Dial into the California Arts Council monthly board <u>meeting</u> and make a public comment about how public support for the arts matters in our community.
Saturday, April 20	Commemorate the 54 th Anniversary of Chicano Park, a gathering place established through grassroot cultural advocacy. This year's theme: "Bringing Back the True Spirit and Energy of the Chicano Park Takeover". Visit <u>https://www.chicano-park.com/</u> for more information.
Sunday, April 21	Grab a cup of coffee and pen a letter to the editor of your local newspaper advocating for greater public investment in arts and culture.
Monday, April 22	Take your advocacy work national and join the Americans for the Arts Action Fund. It's FREE!
Tuesday, April 23	Arrange an office visit with your California Assemblymembers by visiting the legislator's <u>website</u> and submitting a scheduling request. It takes time, so start now!
Wednesday, April 24	Wondering how your organization can safely and legally engage in the voting process, particularly during this heated election year? Visit <u>nonprofitvote.org</u> , the leading provider of nonpartisan resources to help nonprofits integrate voter engagement into their ongoing activities.
Thursday, April 25	The <u>San Diego County Arts and Culture Commission</u> is celebrating its one-year anniversary and releasing its first strategic plan to the community. Come hear what's in store at a community networking event. It's FREE!
Friday, April 26	Attend the <u>City of San Diego Commission for Arts and Culture Meeting</u> and make a public comment in support of ACCM.
Saturday, April 27 - 28	Mission Fed ArtWalk will give you a new appreciation of visual artists and why our advocacy to protect and preserve the work of artists is important. Get out and get inspired for two full days.
